- Volunteer for one or more ACG events during the school year





It is hoped that women will be spiritually uplifted as they come to trust the great love of God.


There will be two offerings. One will go to the World Day of Prayer Committee. The second will be for CWU in New Mexico. You may give to either one, or both!



Advocacy and Bread for the World

This is the time of year when our **Offering of Letters to our members of Congress** can have the greatest meaning. We can urge them to pass legislation and ensure funding that will help end hunger. In Bread for the World's 50th year, our advocacy for nutrition has never been more important.

We are making a difference in the lives of our youngest citizens. Research confirms the impact good nutrition from pre-natal through childhood has on health, learning, school attendance and school graduation rates. WIC is aimed at bolstering the nutrition and healthcare of low-income pregnant women, breastfeeding women and children under age five. SNAP provides food benefits to low-income families to supplement their grocery budget, making nutritious food more affordable for an average of 41 million people in the United States each month. In 2023, the National School Lunch Program gave 4.6 billion lunches to nearly 30 million children in need.

On February 23rd and March 2nd form letters, legislators' addresses, and email contacts will be available in Commons 2 along with assistance from committee members.

Letters will be mailed to the legislators' Washington DC offices in bulk to have the greatest impact.
