A couple of months ago, I shared with all of you the discussion the Session had engaged regarding proposed upgrades to the flooring and chancel of our sanctuary. At that time, the congregation was invited to share its thoughts on the proposed changes with the Session. We were grateful for the feedback as it helped us to identify some of the concerns and hesitations you all had. As these were taken into consideration, we also had the opportunity at our October meeting to speak directly with our partners at Facility Build. Cameron Kilcup has been taking over the running of that company from his dad Brian and reminisced about his time running around the Fellowship Hall as a child attending Wednesday Night Live activities. Cam was able to speak to the Session about the advantage of Facility Build's in-house design/build capabilities as compared to the more traditional approach of hiring an architect and then putting the designs out to bid. Elders were able to ask their questions about the project. We then heard from the chair of the Financial Stewardship committee about ways to fund this project. Because the project includes a lift to improve accessibility in our worship space, we anticipate being able to finance the work at a favorable rate through the Presbyterian Investment and Loan Program. Satisfied with what they heard and mindful of those who expressed reservations about the project, Session nevertheless discerned that these changes would enhance our mission to expand the church's circle. By doing this we can better serve and include community partners who will increase use of our beautiful sanctuary beyond Sunday morning and the church's active membership. A motion was made and passed to proceed with the work by Facility Build at a cost of roughly \$350,000.

Drawings of the proposed improvements will be mounted on poster board and put on display in the commons to give people a better understanding of the changes we'll be making. The signed proposal has been returned to Facility Build, who will work with the city on the permits required to begin construction. We don't expect that to happen until after the first of the year but hope to have all the work done before Easter. Once we have a better understanding of the timeline for construction, we will communicate the necessary changes to Sunday morning worship while the Sanctuary is under construction and strive to minimize disruptions as much as possible. This will likely require some patience and grace with each other and the staff as together we move toward the future God is calling us to as a church in our community.

USING TRADITIONAL IRA TO GIVE TO CHURCH INCOME TAX-FREE

For senior donors to our church (over 70 1/2 years old) with a traditional Individual Retirement Account (IRA) (not Roth IRA, 401k or 403b plans), a direct cash contribution from your IRA to First Presbyterian Church is income tax-free.

Not only is it a nontaxable distribution, it counts towards any Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) that may affect the donor for that year. It also means the donor's Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) for federal income tax purposes is lower than with a taxable IRA distribution. This fact can provide some taxpayers with other tax benefits.

This type of tax-free distribution is limited to an annual amount of \$100,000 per donor to all charities and there are other limitations on the amount of non-taxable distributions related to tax-deductible CONTRIBUTIONS made to an IRA after 70 1/2.

All you have to do is contact your IRA custodian or trustee and ask them how to make a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) to First Presbyterian Church. Not only are you giving to God's work here, but the government provides you an extra bonus tax-wise.

Of course, you cannot double-dip by also claiming a charitable contribution deduction for any income tax-free distribution on Schedule A because it was never recognized as income but that can be better than an itemized deduction.

This is general information available to the public. You must check with your own personal tax advisor to determine if you qualify and how this QCD applies to your particular tax situation.


FIRST PRESBYTERIAN'S DEDICATION SUNDAY
