As I write this, tens of millions of people have already voted early, or by mail-in ballot in the general election. Tens of millions more will turn out to cast their votes on election day. By the time you receive this, we may know the result of the election, or we may not. So many conversations I've had over the past few weeks have shared a weariness over it all. It's hard to tell if the relentless campaigning and 24-7 news cycle bring any added benefit to this exercise of our democratic system of government, or if it is nothing more than expensive noise. I hear a longing for peace amidst the onslaught of ads and texts and direct mail supporting or detracting from all manner of candidates.

Jesus says, "Come to me, all you who are weary and carrying heavy burdens and I will give you rest." This coming Sunday, November 10th, we are going to set aside some time in worship to rest in the healing grace of God that is offered to us in Jesus. We marked this Sunday on the calendar some months back recognizing that regardless of the outcome of the election, everyone would be weary and in need of rest; that our nation and certainly our church family would need some healing from the bruising rhetoric of partisan politics. More than ever we are in need of the reminder from Psalm 146 that we do not put our trust in the rule of earthly leaders, that our hope is not in political outcomes but in the Holy One our God.

Whether the candidate you supported wins, or not, I encourage you to come to worship on the 10th, either early or late. We will offer anointing of oil and prayers of healing for anyone who needs it. And we will lift up each other, our nation, and this world that God so loves to the healing work of God in Jesus Christ. For we are all made one in Him.
