Welcome Dr. Jessie Wenchieh Lo, Organist/Pianist



Dr. Jessie Wenchieh Lo is a Taiwanese American performing artist, recording artist, music educator, and music director. She is a pianist, organist, clarinetist and singer, who has performed in Austria, Belarus, Brazil, China, England, France, Germany, Hong Kong, Italy, Japan, the Netherlands, Poland, Spain, San Marino, Taiwan, and in the United States. She is prize winner in many International Competitions including First Prize and Chopin Prize at The 3rd European Piano Competition Citta del Vasto in Italy; Beethoven Prize from Wiener Beethoven Gesellschaft (Viennese Beethoven Association) at the Vienna

International Pianists Music Festival in Vienna, Austria; and in 2nd International Vienna Piano Competition in Nagoya, Japan; 6th Taipei International Chopin Piano Competition in Taipei, Taiwan; and more. Dr. Lo earned her Bachelor's and Master of Arts degrees in Piano Performance at the University of Music and Performing Arts Vienna, Austria, where she also studied organ and started playing organ in services and concerts in different countries. She received her Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Piano Performance from Boston University, where she taught Piano Individual and Group Lessons; as well as Collaborative Piano. She hosted piano masterclasses in Vienna, Austria; and gave piano masterclasses and performances at Boston University Tanglewood Institute. Dr. Lo has held positions of Music Director, Organist and Pianist in Vienna Austria; Boston Massachusetts; Tallahassee Florida, San Francisco Bay Area California, and Santa Fe New Mexico. Dr. Lo performs regularly with many music organizations and individual artists locally, including New Mexico Philharmonic, Coro Lux, Santa Fe Desert Chorale, and more; as well as in other parts of the U.S, and internationally. Dr. Lo is also Music Director for National Dance Institute New Mexico in Santa Fe, where she composes, arranges, conducts, and performs original music and dance production annually. She also serves as judge at piano competitions. Dr. Lo's piano studio offers in person and online piano lessons with students of all ages and from around the world. Dr. Lo has been continuously serving as a musician in churches since 2000 as pianist, organist, singer, composer, arranger, choir/ orchestra conductor, and music director. She serves as organist and pianist at First Presbyterian Church of Albuquerque. Her favorite things include traveling; listening to her husband, Dr. Jesse Acker-Johnson, plays beautiful guitar; and spending time with her family.

Fiction Book Discussion Group for September


Our next book will be "The Women" by Kristan Hannah. We will be meeting on September 26, 2024 at 10am in the Conference room, meeting leader is Cristy Dockter.

About the book (from the back cover):

Women can be heroes. When twenty-year-old nursing student Frances "Frankie" McGrath hears these words, it is a revelation. Raised in the sun-drenched, idyllic world of Southern California and sheltered by her conservative parents, she has always prided herself on doing the right thing. But in 1965, the world is changing, and she suddenly dares to imagine a different future for herself. When her brother ships out to serve in Vietnam, she joins the Army Nurse Corps and follows his path. As green and inexperienced as the men sent to Vietnam to fight, Frankie is over-whelmed by the chaos and destruction of war. Each day is a gamble of life and death, hope and betrayal; friendships run deep and can be shattered in an instant. In war, she meets—and becomes one of—the lucky, the brave, the broken, and the lost.

But war is just the beginning for Frankie and

her veteran friends. The real battle lies in coming home to a changed and divided America, to angry protesters, and to a country that wants to forget Vietnam.

What's really happening at the Border? Would you life to find out?

The Mission Committee is sponsoring a Border Encounter at the El Paso/Juarez border. You may have attended a Sunday School class last year when Rev. Dr. John Nelson spoke with us about conditions at the border and about the possibility of an Encounter. We know conditions at the border change constantly and are not 'as depicted by the media'. This is an opportunity to see and listen and learn some truths about what is happening there. It is an opportunity for you to bring back to our congregation impressions and information you have gained.

Tres Rios Border Ministry Foundation, located in El Paso about 50 feet from the border, partners with Abara, described as a community of peace builders, to provide Border Encounters. We will be housed in the Abara Guest House located within their facility. Meals are provided.

The dates are November 12th through 14th, three days and three nights. We can take a group of 5 – 8. A passport is required.
