COVID-19 Vaccination opportunities

Last year the Session took action to formally suspend in-person worship indefinitely. At the time, COVID numbers had come down and there were questions about whether we could gather. Rather than continuing to set arbitrary dates for a return with no good data on when it would be safe to do so, Elders felt it better to take that question off the table for the time being. This past week has seen the highest seven-day average of deaths due to COVID since the pandemic began. We are far from out of the woods and continued vigilance, including mask use whenever we're in public, social distancing, limited travel outside the home, and not gathering all remain critical in reducing the spread of the virus. There is, however, hope in the form of the two vaccines currently approved for emergency use, that later this year we will be able to talk about a return to in-person worship. That can only happen if as many people as possible receive the vaccine. While we often think of vaccines as a form of personal protection from the threat of viral infection, like all of our public health protocols they are also an expression of love for our neighbor.

Ruth Gannaway

Ruth was born in Tokay, NM. Her father built this mining town located just southeast of Socorro. At peak it was a town of about 500 residents with a general store, post office, a church, bank, houses, a two-story building (with a pool hall on the ground floor and a school house on the second floor), and Ruth's family's house. Her parents moved there from Ohio after meeting at Ohio State and getting married in 1910. Ruth said if it had been up to her, she would have taken the first train back-it was so barren. Ruth and all of three of her brothers were born in Tokay, Ruth and her two older brothers being born at home. The town closed in the 1940's when the mining operation ended.

Growing up, Ruth remembers the family's Buick LaSalle-a seven passenger. They would take it from their house on High Street and Copper up into the mountains all day to "Supper Rock Park." They would take the ice cream freezer with plenty of ice and rock salt and spend the day while her brothers climbed on the rocks.


In high school, Ruth's best friend was Barbara Simms. It was a really special friendship. Ruth's favorite subject in high school was English. Her fond memories of that time were of watching the circus come into town on the train and walking down to the train station to see all of the animals. Her favorite was walking next to the elephants. That was such a treat!

After high school, Ruth attended Northwestern in Chicago, majoring in business. She loved to dance to the Big Band music. There was a big dance hall at Northwestern with an orchestra to entertain the soldiers who were on leave from the war. Ruth said that during the war many of the young men were off fighting. There was a lady in Albuquerque who wanted to give her son a party to meet people in Albuquerque. Ruth met the lady's son at his party at the Franciscan Hotel. She said he wasn't much of a dancer, but the next day they went to Tingley Beach. They swam in the lake and had a beautiful picnic. She said the beach was just like being in California.

I guess the picnic overcame the lack of dancing ability. He later became her husband.

Ruth is a cat lover. Once they found a little stray sitting by their car. They brought the stray home and that became her favorite. She can't recall its name. Her favorite relative is her niece Mabel. Ruth has known Mabel since Mabel was 6 months old. Mabel, who lives in Rochester, NY, has been like a daughter to Ruth and is still a big part of Ruth's life.

Ruth's favorite color is turquoise and her favorite food is New Mexican. She loves Padilla's and Monroe's. She said her mother was a good cook who even learned New Mexico cooking after coming here from Ohio. And guess what her favorite activity is? No surprise here – volunteering! The "One Albuquerque Award," which is given to city workers and community members who go above and beyond with their service to the public, was awarded to Ruth by Mayor Tim Keller in 2019. Ruth, who is over 100 years old, has volunteered for the past 20 years delivering Meals on Wheels, serving as the Surgical Waiting Room Hostess at Presbyterian Hospital downtown, collecting recyclables for Explora, and crafts and clothing for Bargain Bow – thus fulfilling her secret vocational dream of volunteering!
